

L'ange paddle brush worth your bucks

There are millions of hair brushes on the market and it can be hard to find one that works best for your hair. With many you won't know if it is a good fit till you try it out. I have had this L'ange Hair Siena Paddle Brush for over a year and have loved it.

This L'ange hair brush is black with hints of rose gold on the boar and nylon tipped bristles. The hair brush itself is light but is one of the bigger hair brushes that I have used.

I have curly hair and before this brush, I struggled to find a brush that got out my tangles. The brush I had before this one was a Wet brush and it really only removed the tangles on the top layer of my hair. This is most likely because of how skinny and flexible the bristles were. The brush would just skip over the actual tangles. The L'ange brush does a much better job removing the tangles with minimal tugging. I have a very sensitive scalp and many of the brushes that got the tangles out well, hurt and pulled at my scalp. This brush is not like those, it is very gentle. The L'ange hair brush is also a lot bigger and probably just as light as the wet brush. This makes brushing a lot faster, especially if you have a lot of hair.

The negatives I have with this brush is that they advertise that it helps tame frizzy hair. I personally have not noticed any difference. Also a few of my bristle tips have broken off, not enough to make an impact, but for a \$35 brush, I would not have expected that.

Overall I would rate this a 8/10. With the few negatives and with how expensive the brush was, I could not give it a nine or a ten. I still love the brush and highly recommend you try it out.
